Project Narrative

- 1. Briefly describe the project.
 - a. What were your original objectives?

Population development for residents of poor slums in New Cairo areas, specifically develop ladies to become active elements in supporting their families. The project is handling three phases :

- 1. Literacy classes by CLE method targeting 240 ladies (16 to 45 years old)
- 2. Reproductive health education in conjunction with the literacy classes. The subjects handled are: reducing mortality rate for mothers and infants; support safe motherhood, offer child spacing methods and slowing down population rate of increase, also arrange medical convoys by specialized doctors.
- 3. Prepare and equip sewing shop, teaching ladies basic skills in sewing to be able to produce finished products in proper saleable quality.

The shop will house sewing machines, shearing machine, jockey over

machine, hole button machine and ironing machine .

- b. What was actually accomplished?
- 1. LITERACY PHASE :

Finalized all literacy classes, 240 ladies were graduated after finishing the CLE courses and passed the proper exams.

2. <u>REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH E DUCATION PHASE</u>:

All ladies received the reproductive health education courses conducted by 5 qualified lady doctors. We have made medical convoys for the graduated ladies and their families and offered them the required medications and treatments.

3. VOCATIONAL PHASE:

We have identified the location of the sewing shop and applied for getting the required authorities approvals for preparing the site. We have received three offers for the equipment which we hare techno – economically evaluated. We have purchased and erected the equipment in the shop site after getting the necessary approvals and site preparation. The shop started operation after offering the proper vocational training to the ladies.

c. When and where did the project take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Considering the vast area of New Cairo, we have made the classes in more than one location: in Mansheyat Naser and in Ezbet Elhaggana. The beneficiaries are 240 families residing in those slummy areas.

Literacy classes, reproductive health education, medical convoys and vocational training were finalized successfully to those ladies.

Assigned teams from our members, using their experience in each activity, to prepare, follow up and report the progress of the activities.

Made control sheets given to each instructor and doctor to register attendance and achievement level of each attendant in the classes.

Regular visits to classes to follow up progress of education.

Prepared specifications and design of the shop, made techno- economic evaluations for the offers. Followed- up site preparation, purchasing and installation of the machines.
